Report on Three Days Training Program on Adventure Tourism

A three days training program on adventure tourism for the students of Master's in Tourism & Travel Management (MTTM) was organised by the Department of Tourism, Hospitality & Leisure Studies University of Kashmir in collaboration with Jammu Kashmir Mountaineering and Adventure Club (JKMAC) from February 18 to 20, 2025

This specific training program was designed and organized to help our students on their path of becoming an excellent adventure tourism professional, thereby considerably contributing to the competence of adventure travel guides along the Kashmir Himalayas trail and the valley as whole. This training program was a mixture of classroom activities and field training.

The training programme covered a comprehensive range of topics, including Adventure tourism scenario and resource base, Adventure tourism potential and its operational challenges in Kashmir, display of mountaineering and adventure equipment's, display of adventure documentaries and do's and don'ts of adventure activities.

Participants engaged with adventure tourism experts, entrepreneurs, and mentors who provided valuable insights and guidance throughout the programme.

The training programme was inaugurated on February 18, 2025 at the Department of Tourism Hospitality & Leisure Studies by Prof. Shariefudin Pirzada, Dean Academic Affairs University of Kashmir, who was the Chief Guest on the occasion, while as Mr. Mauzam Bakhshi President; Jammu & Kashmir Mountaineering & Adventure Club (JKMAC) was the Guest of Honor.

The inaugural session witnessed the participation of faculty members of the department, members and office bearers of JKMAC, young adventure tourism entrepreneurs, and scholars and students of the department.

In his welcome address, Head Department of Tourism, Hospitality & Leisure Studies, Dr Reyaz Ahmed Qureshi formally welcomed all the guests, speakers, teaching, non-teaching staff, Research scholars and students. While giving the opening remarks, he said that the department is in close coordination with the tourism industry and are organizing such programs for the practical exposure

In the post inaugural session-1 Mr. Nawab Mozam Khan from JKMAC provided a detailed analysis of the Adventure Tourism and its operational challenges in Kashmir.
